Dangerous Climate Change: The Most Serious Environmental Threat Facing our Planet

The Problem

The scientific consensus is in: climate change is real and it is the most serious environmental threat facing our planet. It is no longer possible to talk of some future time when the heating of the planet will begin to have adverse effects: that time is now and climate change is already happening.

Australia's fragile environment is especially vulnerable to climate change. Climate change is caused by an accumulation of heat-trapping greenhouse gases in our atmosphere. The most abundant greenhouse gas is human-made carbon dioxide (CO₂). CO₂ emissions come from the burning of fossil fuels like oil, coal and natural gas. Australia has the world's highest per capita emissions of the greenhouse pollution that causes climate change, mainly because of our coal and aluminium sectors. The energy-hungry aluminium industry uses 20% of Australia's electricity while greenhouse-polluting coal is used to generate almost 90% of our power.

South Australia on the frontline of climate change

South Australia is the driest state within the driest inhabited continent on the planet and climate change will only make the situation worse. Climate change will mean a hotter, drier climate with droughts, floods, bushfires and more extreme weather events that will affect our ecosystems including agricultural production in areas such as the Murray Darling Basin. In fact, the Murray Darling Basin has been identified as one of the regions most susceptible to climate change and it is estimated that the River Murray could lose the equivalent of four times South Australia's annual water use with the onset of climate change.

With Federal Government failure the SA Government needs to do more.

Against the wishes of the majority of Australians, the Federal Government has refused to ratify the Kyoto Protocol and take responsibility for Australia's shameful position as the nation with the highest level of per capita greenhouse gas emissions on the planet. As a result, responsibility has fallen to state governments to tackle the problem. Here in SA, we have the highest percentage of power derived from renewable sources, with nearly 11% of our power coming from wind farms by the end of the year and the largest proportion of grid-connected solar power (PV) systems in the country.

However, next year the Federal Government's mandatory renewable energy target (MRET) will be fully subscribed and this means that growth in the renewable energy industry will stall unless other measures to secure the future of the industry are introduced. SA needs to put in place long term programs to ensure we reduce our greenhouse pollution and make the switch to clean, renewable energy.

Jumpstart the Clean Energy Revolution!

Greenpeace and the Conservation Council of SA have initiated a SA Clean Energy Now campaign that is all about inspiring the clean energy revolution that will protect us, and future generations, from dangerous climate change.

Scientists say that by 2050 we must reduce our greenhouse gas emissions by 60%. The positive news is that this is truly possible. With cleaner energy sources, energy efficiency and energy conservation, we can reach this target. What is lacking is the political will. Our leaders need to understand that global warming is a problem but also an opportunity. If we act now we will have many benefits, like jobs and cleaner air.

One big step in the right direction will be to legislate a target for 25% of South Australia's energy to come from clean sources by 2020.

We can clean up South Australia's dirty energy use but we need your help to push for 25% clean energy by 2020 and a minimum of 60% cuts in greenhouse pollution by 2050.

10 easy ways to take action on climate change

1. Visit your local member of Parliament.

Face to face visits are very powerful as they demonstrate how you, the constituent, feel about this issue.

Remember you don't need to be an expert on the issue to have an opinion that your representatives should listen to.

A list of all sitting members of parliament is included at the back of this pack.

With the next State election fast approaching in March 2006 its also worth contacting candidates other than the sitting member to let them know that their policies on climate change and renewable energy may influence your vote.

2. Write a letter to the Premier and to the ministers responsible for climate change and renewable energy policy

Letter writing is another extremely powerful tool, especially if your letter is hand-written and in your own words.

3. Write to newspaper editors

Keep letters short, sharp and witty and they'll have a much better chance of getting published. Local newspapers can be really influential so don't forget to write to your local paper. Why not tell them about what you're doing to reduce your greenhouse pollution and challenge your local political representatives to do more.

4. Call talk-back radio

Talk-back radio reaches a huge audience so it's a good opportunity to spread the word about why SA should get serious about making the shift to clean renewable sources of energy. Remember again you don't have to be an expert to have an opinion. You might just want to say you've seen one of the SA windfarms or solar power stations, you think they are great and you reckon the government should try and make sure there are more of them.

5. Pass a resolution in support of clean energy in your union, school committee or other type of club **and then send it to the Premier and your local member.**

A sample resolution:

"The x committee urges the South Australian Government and all SA political parties to take the strongest possible action on climate change. We know that SA is going to be particularly hard-hit by climate change. As a community group we're going to do the following things to reduce our climate impact ...

However in the absence of strong government action we won't as a community be able to make the necessary greenhouse pollution reductions. In the lead up to next year's state election we call on Premier Mike Rann and Opposition Leader Rob Kerin to ensure that both parties commit to reducing South Australia's greenhouse pollution and to

implementing legislation to increase SA's use of clean, renewable energy to 25% by 2020."

6. **Establish a resident action group on climate change** and do a media launch of the group in your backyard. For help with this, email sacleanenergy@au.greenpeace.org or ring Catherine Way on 08 8223 5155. Organise some community events - you might want to hold regular stalls to raise awareness about climate change, organise community lobbying delegations to your local MP, or hold a house party where you get together with some friends, watch a video on climate change and then work out what you're going to do to make sure it doesn't happen.
7. **Follow-up** - Follow-up any meeting or letters from politicians to you with another letter or phone call. If a politician hears from you once, they'll think they've solved the problem. If they keep hearing from you they'll know they still need to do more.
8. **Sign up** to help Greenpeace and the Conservation Council of SA with regular stalls and letterboxing in the Norwood area.
9. **Advertise your support** - Put an 'I love clean energy and I vote' sign in your front yard or window. Make your own or email sacleanenergy@au.greenpeace.org to ask for one.
10. **Keep us informed**- Go for it and enjoy your climate campaigning, but it would be really helpful if you could drop us an email and let us know of any progress you're having, any interesting conversations you've had with polities, or any questions you've got. Sample letter to politicians and electoral candidates.

Dear

Australia is addicted to using greenhouse-polluting coal for electricity and export dollars. Coal fired power is Australia's biggest greenhouse polluter. Around 50% of South Australia's electricity is still produced by burning coal. As you know, South Australia is extremely vulnerable to the impacts of climate change. As Premier / Minister for the Environment / my local member, you can help make the switch from coal to clean renewable energy.

I urge you to meet the climate challenge by:

- Committing South Australia to at least 60% greenhouse gas emissions reductions by 2050 with a target of 20% by 2020 to show real progress, and call for the Federal Government to ratify the Kyoto Protocol.
- Implementing a state renewable energy target of 25% by 2020 with a 15% interim target for 2010 **with supporting legislation.**
- Introducing an energy efficiency and demand management fund to stabilise and then reduce residential, industrial and government electricity consumption with supporting legislation and programs.
- Committing to setting a price on greenhouse pollution through an emissions trading scheme or carbon tax.
- Introducing an immediate moratorium on new coal generation for South Australia
- Increasing cycling, walking and the use of public transport to 20% of weekday travel by 2015.

In the future, Australian leaders will be remembered for the way they dealt with climate change, the greatest challenge of our time. Join the clean energy revolution and make South Australia a leader in tackling climate change.
