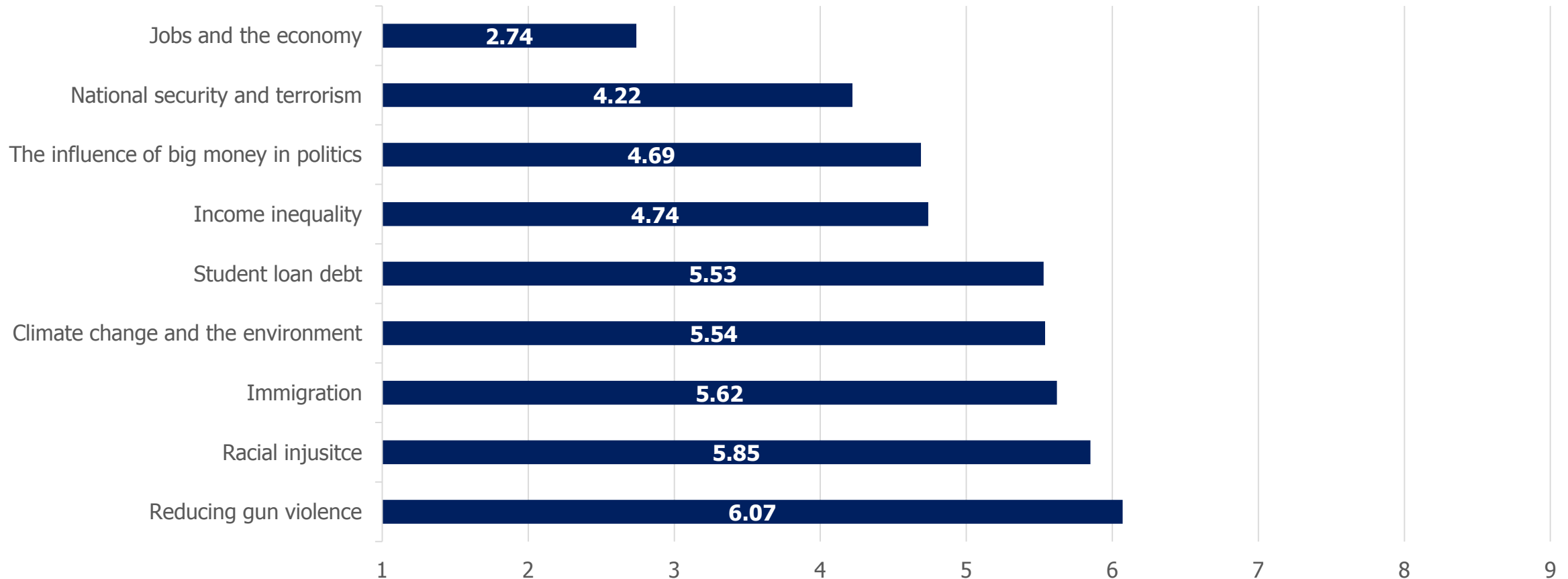

This survey was conducted online between April 29 and May 13 of 2016 from a panel of registered voters age 18 to 34 recruited by YouGov. The data were weighted to match the U.S. Census distribution of gender and race within each of the four target states.

Young voters are most concerned about jobs and the economy, followed by national security, money in politics, and income inequality

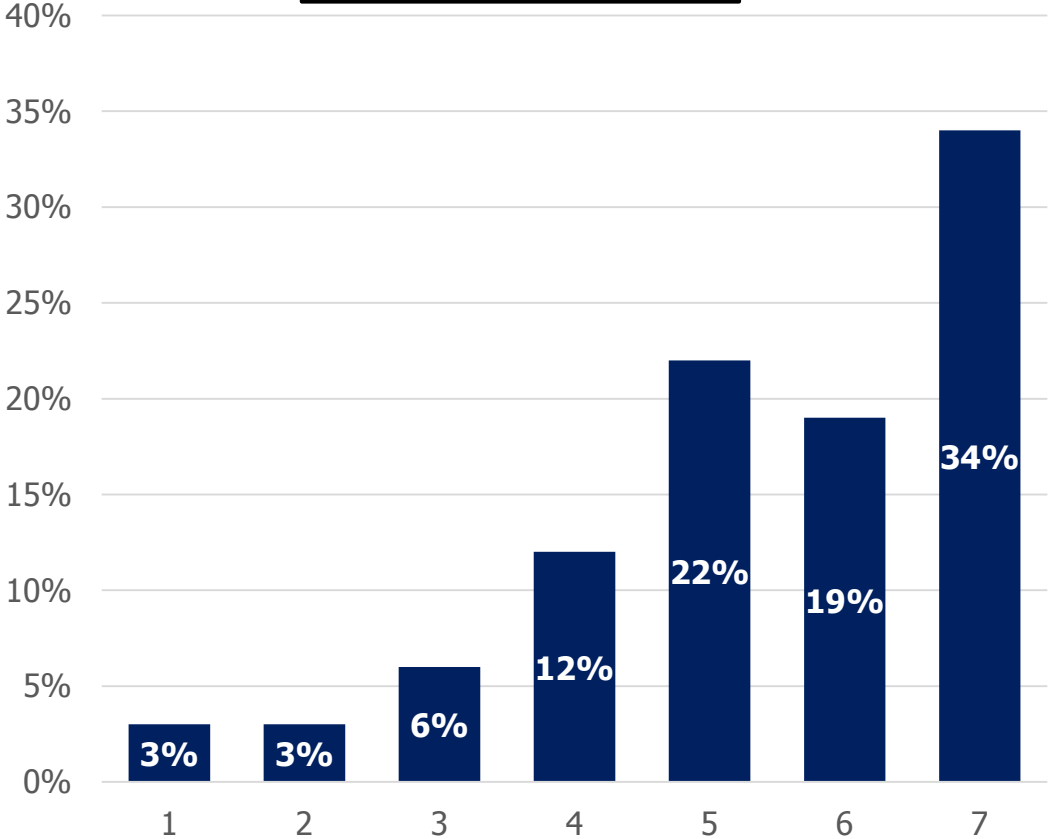
Please rank the following issues in order from most to least concerning, with 1 being the issue that concerns you the most and 9 being the issue that concerns you the least. (ROTATE)



Money in politics is a major concern, and a plurality say money has equal influence over both parties

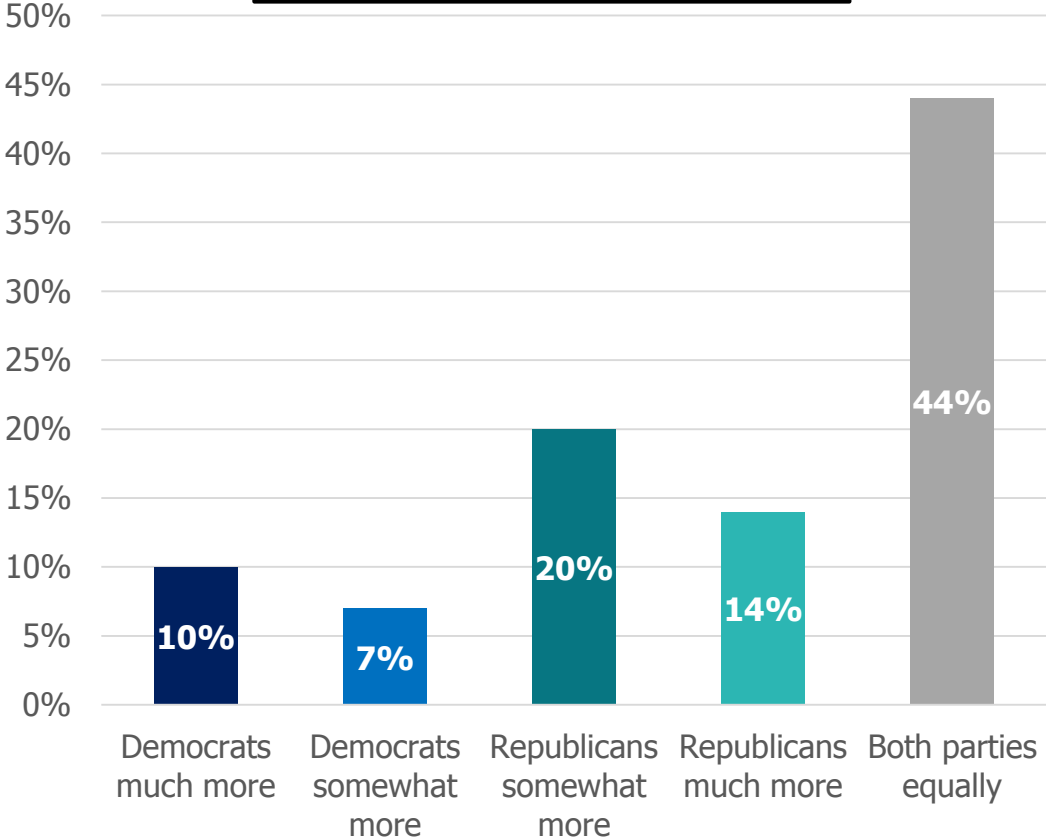

When thinking about the role of money in politics, do you think money has more influence over the Democratic party or the Republican party? (IF CHOICE: Is that much more or somewhat more?)

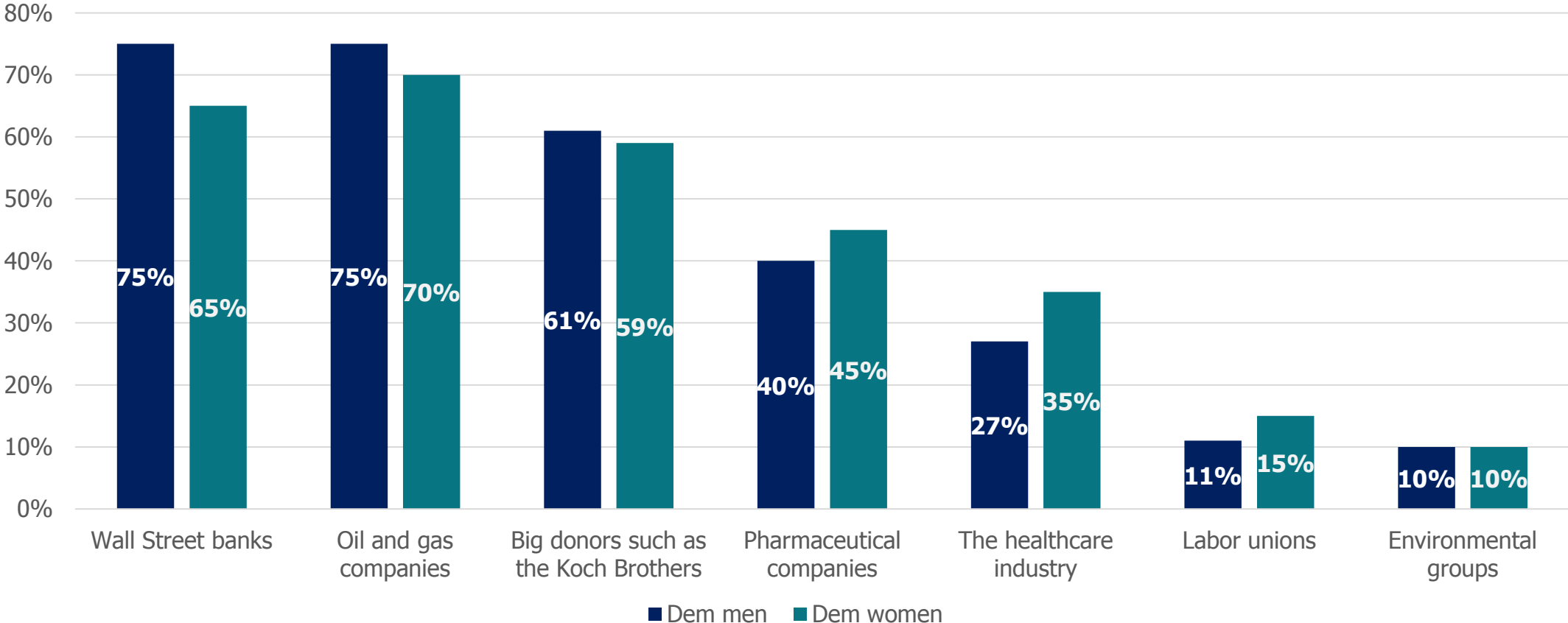
Money Influences Most
